

Year 6 Curriculum Overview Autumn Term 1

<u>English</u>

Vocabulary Fiction Non-Fiction

Pupils will discuss and use a variety of high level vocabulary relating to emotions such as surprise, joy, fear and anger. Next, they will explore diary writing by learning about the experiences of the passengers aboard the Empire Windrush. In October we will explore non-fiction report writing about the animals of the Antarctic. Throughout these units we will explore writing skills such as the use of different sentence types, fronted adverbials and various kinds of subordinate clauses.

<u>Maths</u>

Pupils will consolidate their knowledge of place value and name, order, read and write numbers up to 100,000,000. Pupils will continue to use the long and short formal written method of multiplication used in Year 5 to accurately solve problems. Pupils will use short division to interpret remainders in the context of the question and use long division to divide by 2 digit number.
