

Year 3 Curriculum Overview Spring Term 2

English

Children will start the half term by further improving their vocabulary skills. They will then study The BFG by Roald Dahl to create their own piece of writing. Whilst using The BFG as a base, children will continue to develop their grammar skills. They will develop and consolidate knowledge of compound sentences and coordinating conjunctions. Children will also learn about the use of suffixes in past and present tense verbs.

Maths

This half term, the pupils will explore fractions. They will reinforce their learning from Key Stage 1 while moving on to making a whole with unit and non-unit fractions. They will also explore: tenths as fractions, fractions as numbers and fractions of a set of objects. The children will also look at measures again this half term. Building on their prior knowledge from Year 2, they will concentrate on mass and capacity. They will spend time measuring using scales and reading them accurately.

Science

This half term, children will be learning all about light and shadow. This will include sources of light, what a reflection is and what creates a shadow. Children will work scientifically by investigating shadows.

Humanities

Geography this half term
will be all about
Antarctica. Children will
learn about where
Antarctica is and what
the climate is like there.
They will develop an
understanding of who
might visit Antarctica and
finally, learn about who
Shackleton is and what he
has to do with Antarctica.

Design and Technology

During this half term, the children will explore the digital world in particular the ability to wear technology. They will research existing products to create a design and then make their own product. They will write a program to initiate a flashing LED panel. When designing their product, they will also look at how they attach the product.

Computing

Pupils will study
branching databases.
They will create a
physical and on-screen
branching database and
will decide what types of
data should be presented
as a branching database.

French

In French, children will be learning all about what we would find in a French classroom including learning the names of resources and classroom equipment.

Music

Children will be using the glockenspiels a lot this half term as their focus is on instruments. Children will explore what the terms: staff notation, minim and semibreve mean. They will develop this knowledge by putting it into practice using a glockenspiel.

RE

This half term, children will be focusing on the question, 'What happens if I do wrong?' They will explore what confession is and why some people seek God's forgiveness.

PE

Pupils will be practising their hockey and tennis skills this half term. In both games, they will focus upon their attack and defending skills as well as continue to work on their team work. Pupils will focus primarily upon their techniques when holding their rackets/sticks and how to best control the ball.

PSHE

The main focus for PSHE this half term is learning how to help in an emergency. They will understand the role they can take in an emergency situation including how to make a phone call to the emergency services. Pupils will learn what to do when someone has been stung or bitten.

Assembly Themes

Children will learn about the school value of **courtesy** this half term through our assemblies. They will also learn about the significance of Easter for Christians and celebrate World Book Day and STEM Science Week.
