



Year 1 Curriculum Overview Summer Term 2

English

Pupils will study humorous stories and will begin to think about how these are written. Pupils will continue to develop their descriptive writing skills as well as writing their own narratives. Pupils will also continue to develop their knowledge of information texts and will think about the features of these in detail.

Maths

Pupils will develop their confidence with numbers to 100 and will explore numbers and numbers bonds as well as spotting patterns. Pupils will also begin learning about time and telling the time to the nearest half hour. Pupils will also begin to recognise coins and notes and counting money.

Phonics – Pupils will continue to follow the Read Write Inc scheme for phonics and will read independently within all daily phonics lessons. They will be grouped according to their stage on the programme and will learn to read, write and spell words that contain the focus sounds. Pupils will also continue to build upon their knowledge of everyday 'red words' which cannot be decoded as they do not follow a specific phonic pattern.

Science

Pupils will be using all of the knowledge that they have learnt this year in order to carry out a number of scientific experiments. They will explore different topics through the use of picture books and then carrying out practical explorations. Pupils will also learn to record their results.

Humanities –Geography

Pupils will compare what it is like to live in the UK with what it is like to live in Shanghai. They will learn about human and physical features and will learn about comparing the features of the two locations. They will also look at finding the two places on a map.

Art and Design

Pupils will learn about the importance of healthy eating and the different nutrients that fruits and vegetables can provide. They will name a number of fruits and vegetables. They will also learn about how to prepare a number of fruits and vegetables in order to make their own smoothies.

Computing

Pupils will develop their data handling skills as they identify different ways that data can be represented.

Languages

Pupils will continue to learn about colours in French.

Music

Pupils will use all of the musical skills that they have learnt this year in order to create a musical performance that uses instrumental, vocal and body sounds. Pupils will perform a piece of music based on the theme of 'Under the Water' and will think about how this can be shown with music.

RE

Pupils will explore the question 'Should we care for others?' and will explore what different religions say about caring for others. Pupils will compare what different religions say about caring for others and think about how this can motivate and inspire others.

PE

Pupils will begin to develop their athletics skills in preparation for Sports Day this half term. They will also begin to use the skills that they have developed this year in order to put these into a number of different game based situations.

PSHE

Pupils will continue to learn about the importance of money. They will think about where money comes from, what they do with it and how to save and spend their money.

Assembly Themes

Children will learn about **growth** this half term and will be reflecting on the academic year as it draws to a close. They will also learn about the significance of Eid-Al Adha for Muslims and the work of the NSPCC. We will also be celebrating Pride Month in June where the children will focus on acceptance, equality and celebrating the work of LGBTQ+ people. 1B will be performing their class assembly about mathematics and year 6 will be performing their production of Matilda Jr.
