



Year 1 Curriculum Overview Summer Term 2

<u>English</u> Pupils will study stories on the theme of Superheroes and will think about writing their own superhero stories. Pupils will also continue to develop their understanding of information texts and the features of these. Pupils will also be looking at 'Fantastic First Poems'.		<u>Maths</u> Pupils will develop their confidence with numbers to 100 and will explore numbers and numbers bonds as well as spotting patterns. Pupils will also begin learning about time and telling the time to the nearest half hour. Pupils will also begin to recognise coins and notes and counting money.	
<u>Phonics</u> – Pupils will continue to follow the Read Write Inc scheme for phonics and will read independently within all daily phonics lessons. They will be grouped according to their stage on the programme and will learn to read, write and spell words that contain the focus sounds. Pupils will also continue to build upon their knowledge of everyday 'red words' which cannot be decoded as they do not follow a specific phonic pattern.			
<u>Science</u> Pupils will learn about plants. They will learn about different types of plants and their structure as well as naming a variety of different flowering plants and trees. Pupils will also have planting some seeds and watch what happens to them over time.	<u>Humanities -Geography</u> Pupils will learn about the continents and Oceans and will develop their confidence to be able to name and locate these on a map. Pupils will also learn about the differences between the continents and the important things that the different continents have to offer.	<u>Art and Design</u> Pupils will learn about the importance of healthy eating and the different nutrients that fruits and vegetables can provide. They will name a number of fruits and vegetables. They will also learn about how to prepare a number of fruits and vegetables in order to make their own smoothies.	<u>Computing</u> Pupils will develop their data handling skills as they identify different ways that data can be represented.
<u>Music</u> Pupils will continue to explore sound through music. They will begin to explore how we can use music to tell a story. Pupils will use their composition skills to have a go at making their own pieces of music that tell a story.	<u>RE</u> Pupils will continue to learn about the Jewish faith and will be thinking about answering the question: 'Is Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur important to Jewish children?'	<u>PE</u> Pupils will spend their PE lessons developing their football and kicking skills. They will also begin to develop their striking skills with a range of bat, racket and ball games. They will also be practising for sports day.	<u>Languages</u> Pupils will continue to learn about transport in French.
			<u>PSHE</u> Pupils will continue to learn about the importance of money. They will think about where money comes from, what they do with it and how to save and spend their money.

Assembly themes

Children will learn about growth this half term and will be reflecting on the academic year as it draws to a close.
