

<u>English</u>

Pupils will develop their understanding and use of prepositional phrases as well as consolidating adverbs, adjectives, verbs and nouns that were taught in Year 2. The children will study the genres of stories from other cultures and non-chronological reports using the focus books The Tiger Child by Joanna Troughton, Rama and Sita by Malachy Doyle and Christopher Corr and The Children's Book of Sport published by Dorling Kindersley.

<u>Maths</u>

Pupils will secure their understanding of place value and extend their skills to 3 digit numbers. They will be counting from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100; find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number. Also, they will compare and order numbers up to 1,000 as well as identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations. Pupils will read and write numbers up to 1,000 in numerals and in words and solve number problems and practical problems.
